Dear Parents and Families,

As we stated in the email that was sent out from Student Development on January 21st, Colby-Sawyer College is committed to continued testing throughout the spring semester, which will include surveillance testing for faculty, staff and students at a level consistent with the positivity rate in the region. As of January 19th, we will have tested all faculty, staff and students for reentry for the spring semester. Throughout the semester, we will continue to provide surveillance testing of unvaccinated faculty, staff and students with approved medical exemptions, individuals who have traveled to high risk areas and symptomatic students.

Additionally, we hope you have taken advantage of an opportunity to have four COVID-19 testing kits mailed to your household at no cost. In mid-January, the federal government formally launched the website <u>COVIDtests.gov</u> in an effort to increase access to testing across the country. According to the website, orders usually ship within 7-12 days. Given differing availability of COVID-19 testing kits based on location, we felt it important to notify you of this opportunity.



Spring Break Travel:

Please contact Jen Schad, Program Manager for Student Development (<u>ien.schad@colby-</u><u>sawyer.edu</u>) if your student needs assistance with travel to and from the Manchester Airport or to the Dartmouth Coach bus stop in New London which transports passengers to South Station and Logan Airport in Boston.

*Tickets for Dartmouth Coach bus trips must be purchased ahead of time on their website <u>https://dartmouthcoach.com/</u>. Dartmouth Coach does not guarantee seats even if a ticket has been purchased, so remember to allow a buffer of extra time, especially if your student is making a connection at Logan Airport. It is best to catch an earlier bus than needed and have a longer wait at the airport than to risk not making it to a flight in time. Winter weather should also be considered, as it can be unpredictable and cause unanticipated travel problems.

Over the break my team and I started thinking more deeply about the "Big Six", i.e. experiences in college that increase the likelihood of students graduating in four years as well thriving in life after college.

According to the Gallup-Purdue Index (and summarized quite nicely at the link below) there are six experiences that can be life changing for students. Our team is working across academics, peer mentoring, student support services, and student activities to ensure that we are providing these to all students.

- 1. A professor who gets them excited to learn
- 2. Professors who care about them as an individual
- 3. A mentor who understands their dreams and goals and helps students pursue them
- 4. The opportunity to work on a meaningful, long-term project, often longer than one semester
- 5. A job or internship that allows them to apply their growing knowledge
- 6. Full participation in co-curricular clubs, athletics, and / or student organizations (Busteed, 2015, para. 3)

And, there are ways you can help from home! Encourage your student to:

- Connect with professors in office hours to clarify concepts and also to build relationships.
- Share their goals and dreams with peer mentors, supervisors, professors, and academic advisors

Once an email is received from the resort stating that your pass is ready, log in at <u>www.epicpass.com</u> to accept the liability release and to upload a photo.

If you had a pass last year, you do not need to upload a photo. You will need to show your student ID when you pick up your pass. *Reservations will not be required to ski this year.*

If you do not receive an email within a week of completing the form, you can call the resort at 603-763-3500 to check the status of your pass.
