IMPORTANT NEWS FROM RESIDENTIAL EDUCATION

It's hard to believe, but it's almost time for students to select their housing for 2019-20! On Monday, March 18, students will receive an email with all the information they'll need to participate in Room Draw, the online process through which they'll sign their annual room and board contract and select their room and roommates for next year. If your student has questions about Room Draw, please direct them to the March 18th email. The email will include a link to the Room Draw site on myColby-Sawyer, which has detailed information about the process and a lengthy Frequently Asked Questions list. The actual room selection will take place in April.

Back in January, we emailed students to let them know that if they need special housing accommodation next year due to a disability, they need to apply for the accommodation through the office of Access Resources, even if they currently have a housing accommodation. Those requests and the supporting documentation are due to Access Resources by Friday, March 22. The request form can be found at: <u>https://colby-sawyer.edu/access-resources</u>.

It's also important to remember that students who entered the college in Fall, 2017 or later are required to live on campus unless they have been granted an exception to our residency requirement, which can be found at https://colby-sawyer.edu/assets/resed/Residency-Requirement.pdf. Students who entered the college in Spring, 2017 or earlier may choose to live off campus. If they choose a room during the Room Draw process, they may break their contracts without penalty by May 15. After May 15, they will be responsible for paying the full cost of room and board for the year.

We know this can be a stressful process for students, especially if this is their first time selecting room. Please know that we are working hard to give them all the information they need to be successful. And please remind them to check their email daily throughout March and April!

IMPORTANT CALENDAR DATES AND INFORMATION FROM ACADEMIC ADVISING

Sunday, March 17, 9 am, Residence Halls open

Friday, March 29, Deadline to withdraw from classes

Monday – Wednesday, March 25 – 27, Fall and Summer Registration

Registration begins on Monday, March 25. Students will want to meet with advisors prior to their assigned registration date to discuss summer and fall classes. The best tool students have to know if they are on track to graduate is their "planning worksheet." Students can access their own planning worksheets on Argos. If they have trouble finding their worksheet, they can contact the Help Desk for assistance.

Midterm grades will be posted on PowerCampus by midnight on Wednesday, March 20. Midterm grades are only required for first year students and students receiving less than a C at midterm. Students who do not see a grade posted should talk to their professors if they are unsure about their grade in the course. If students have a low midterm grade in any course, they should do the following:

1. Make a plan for improvement. This plan may include one-on-one help from professor, working with tutors in the Student Learning Collaborative (SLC) which is referred to below, or seeking assistance on time management or study skills from the SLC.

2. Make an appointment with their academic advisor for guidance. Academic advisors can help with an improvement plan, or (in certain circumstances) they may recommend students withdraw from the course and start fresh another semester.
